The company’s management team, with the help of DN Partners, significantly grew and expanded the business - doubling the company’s size as well as introducing new product lines into the market. Under leadership from DN Partners, the company was recapitalized in 2004 to provide growth capital for the development of its Cen-Tite® hybrid container. The company further expanded the Cen-Tite® line in 2008 to include an all-plastic quart and gallon container, which positively impacted the market.
